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Manual Durometer PCE-2000



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1 Introduction

1.1 General

Thank you for purchasing a PCE-2000 hardness tester from PCE Instruments.

This meter serves to quickly test the surface hardness of metallic materials according to the parameters Rockwell B & C, Vickers HV, Brinell HB, Shore HS and Leeb HL. Due to its external digital display showing all the functions and measured values, confusions and faulty measurements can be ruled out. The hardness tester has a statistics function, a data storage function and an R-S232 interface to send data to the computer or laptop (software and cables are included in the delivery). This device can be used in any position, even overhead, with angle selection and adjustment. The impact body fits easily on top of the item to be measured.

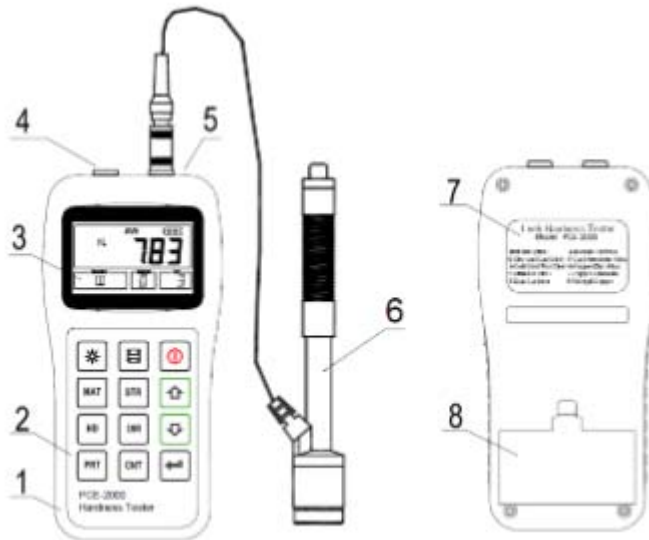

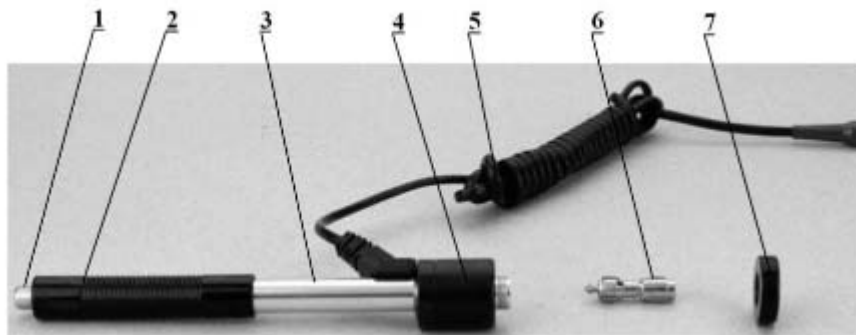
4 System description

4.1 Device



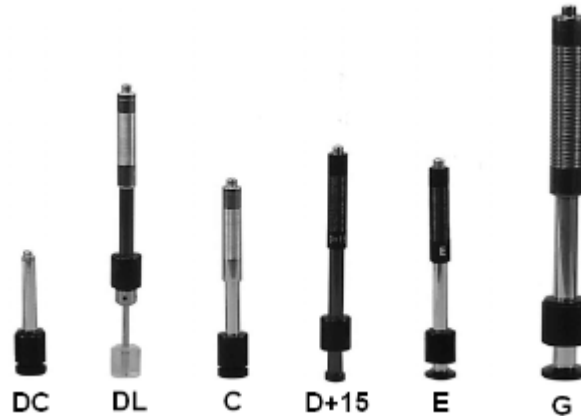
- (1) main device

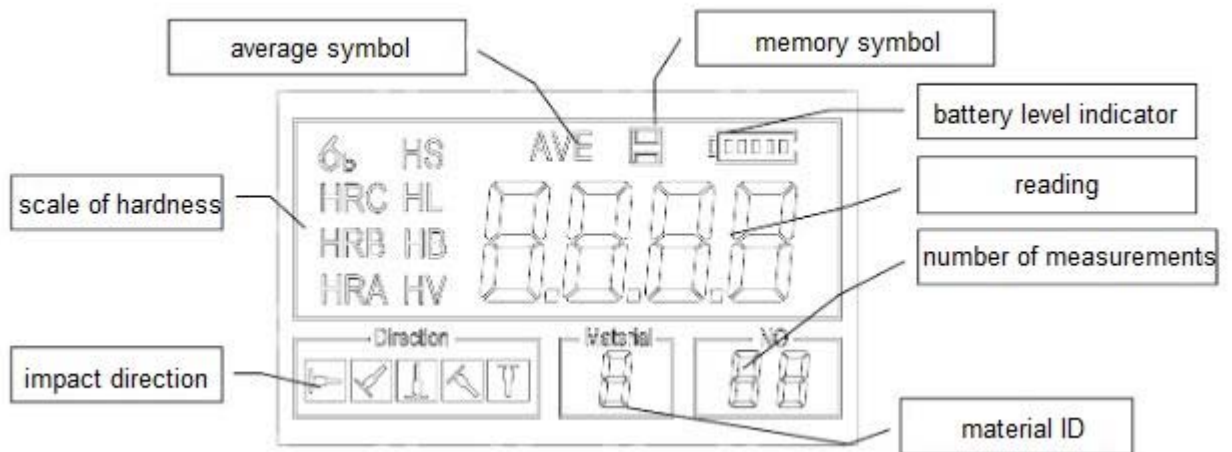


- (1) trigger button

4.4 Display



Material ID: shows current material default setting.

Impact direction: shows the direction of impact.

Scale of hardness: shows the unit of measurement of the current reading.

Battery level indicator: shows the battery level.

Reading: shows the individual measured value (if no average symbol is displayed) or the calculated average (if the average symbol is displayed).













- "HI" means that the reading exceeds the measuring range or the conversion value.
- "LO" means that the reading is lower than the measuring range or the conversion value.















Number of measurements: shows the number of the hitherto measurements of a series.

Average symbol: appears when the average value is displayed. This will be the case as soon as the preset number of impacts is reached.

Memory symbol: appears when the data memory of the device is retrieved.

4.5 Assignment of keys

- Press  to save the current set of readings. This function can only be carried out after the average value has been displayed.
- Press  and  to show individual readings.
- Press  to switch the display backlight on or off.
- Press  to set the impact direction.
- Press  to change the number of impacts (number of measurements) in a series. The symbol “number of measurements” will flash when  is pressed for the first time. The number is increased when  is pressed and decreased when  is pressed. At the end, press  to leave the number of impacts menu.
- Press  to change the scale of hardness.
- Press  to change the material ID. The hardness scale will automatically change to HL.
- Press  to switch between hardness and strength measurement. A strength measurement can only be carried out with D and DC type impact bodies. When an impact body of another type is connected, this function cannot be activated.
- Press  to print the readings after the measurement.

5 Measurement principle

An impact body of a certain weight is pushed against a test piece at a defined strength. The impact of the impact body results in a minimal deformation of the surface. The spherical impact body is located 1 mm over the test surface. The speed of the impact of the impact body is then measured in relation to the speed of the rebound of the impact body. The calculation formula is:

$HL = 1000 \times VB / VA$, whereas







HL is the Leeb hardness value

VB is the rebound speed of the impact body and

VA is the impact speed of the impact body

6 Instructions

6.1 Preparing and checking the device

When checking the device, use the standard calibration block included in the delivery content. The deviations and the reproducibility of the displayed value should be within the tolerances which you can find in chart 2. The device and the impact device must be calibrated using the standard calibration block before first use, after a longer period of non-use or after a system reset. Press  while holding . The user calibration screen is now shown. Measure five different points on the standard calibration block. The device will show the average value after five measurements. Use  or  to change the nominal value. Press  to confirm the calibration or  to stop the calibration. The adjustment range comprises ± 30 HL. The measurement parameters such as material selection, the scales of hardness and the impact direction cannot be changed during calibration.

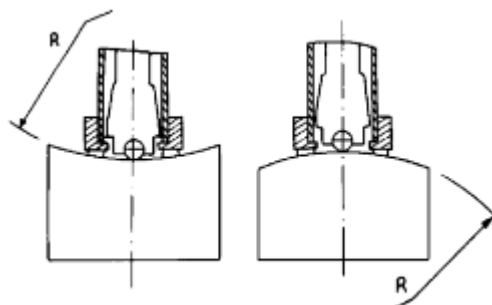
Note: Use a calibrated hardness tester and test the standard calibration block vertically five times. Compare the arithmetic average value to the value of the standard calibration block. In case this value exceeds the standard value, the function "user calibration" can be used to adapt the device.

6.1.1 To select an impact body

Use the charts 1 and 3 in the appendix to select an impact body.

6.1.2 To prepare the surface to be measured

- The preparation of the surface of the material sample to be measured must come up to the requirements laid down in chart 3 in the appendix.
- During the preparation of the surface of the sample, the test surface should not heat up or cool down due to the hardening effect.
- The surface to be measured should not be too uneven or coarse. This could cause deviations. The sample to be measured should have a metallic lustre and be smoothed, polished and free from grease.
- For a heavy material sample, a certain base is not necessary. Medium-heavy parts must be placed on an even and solid base. The sample must stand completely horizontally and flatly.
- Curved surfaces: Even surfaces are easiest to measure. If the radius of curvature R of the test surface is smaller than 30 mm (type of impact device D, DC, D+15, C, E and DL) or smaller than 50 mm (type of impact device G), the small retaining ring or the curved base ring should be used.
- The material sample should have a minimum thickness which you can see in chart 3.
- If the sample has a hardened surface, the thickness of the hardened layer should be the value from chart 3.




- Coupling: Medium-heavy samples must be sufficiently in contact with a heavy ground plate. Both surfaces lying on top of each other must be even and flat and free from coupling gel. The impact direction must be vertical to the base. If the sample is a big plate, a long bar or a flexible part, it can deform and become unstable, even if it is sufficiently heavy and thick. As this may cause faulty measurements, the part to be measured should be supported or strengthened.
- Magnetism of the sample should be avoided.

6.2 Testing procedure

6.2.1 To switch the device on

- Connect the plug of the impact body to the socket of the device.
- Press  to switch on the device. The device is now in operating mode.

6.2.2 To load the device

- Push the loading tube downwards until you feel a contact. Then let the tube slowly return to its starting position.

6.2.3 To place the impact body

- Push the bearing ring of the impact body firmly against the surface of the sample, bearing in mind that the impact direction should always run vertically to the test surface.

6.2.4 To carry out a measurement

- Push the trigger button of the impact device to make a measurement. The sample, as well as the impact body and the user should now stand still and stable.
- Each part of the sample should be measured 3 to 5 times. The deviations of the values should not be higher than ± 15 HL.
- The distances between the two points of impact and to the edge of the material sample should be in the range of the limit values from charts 1-4.
- If you would like to make an exact conversion of the Leeb measurement value into other hardness measurement values, you need a contrasting test to find out about the conversion relationships of different materials. Use a certified Leeb hardness tester and another corresponding hardness tester to measure the same material sample. For each hardness value, measure the Leeb hardness value at five different points and calculate the resulting average value.

6.2.5 To read the measurement value


After each impact process, the LCD will display the measured value. After further impacts, the device will emit a log sound if the measured value is not within the valid measurement range. As soon as the preset number of measurements has been reached, another long sound will be emitted. After two seconds, the device will emit a short sound and the display will show the average measured value.

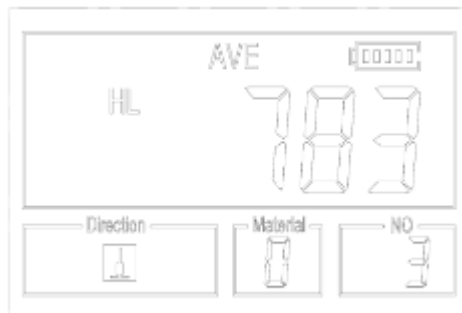
Note


- The impact device may only be changed when the device is switched off. Otherwise the main device cannot recognise the type of impact device, which may cause damage to the main device.
- You cannot save the current measurement value if the impact frequency is lower than the preset value.
- You can only measure the tensile strength with type D and type DC impact devices. You cannot switch to the default setting for testing the tensile strength if another impact device is being used. The setting automatically changes to hardness testing.
- Not all materials can be converted into scale of hardness values. The scale of hardness is automatically reset to HL after the material has been changed. Therefore, you must first choose the material and then the scale of hardness.

6.3 Instruction details


6.3.1 To switch the device on and off

Press  to switch the device on. Make sure that you have connected the impact device before you switch on the device. The system will automatically recognise and display the type of impact device when you switch it on. Pay attention to the probe shown on the display. After a few seconds, the information will disappear and the main display will appear as follows:



You can switch off the device by pressing  while the device is working. It has a special memory which saves all settings, even when the device is switched off.


6.3.2 Material selection

Press  to select the material to be tested. The hardness scale will automatically return to HL after you have changed the material settings. Please select the material first before choosing the scale of hardness. You can choose between the following materials to be tested: steel and cast steel, alloyed tool steel, stainless steel, grey cast iron, spheroidal graphite iron, cast aluminium alloys, red brass, copper-aluminium alloys, wrought copper and wrought steel. The allocation of the material number to the material on the display is as follows:

For the following materials, a tensile strength measurement is not possible: soft steel, high-carbon steel, chrome steel, Cr-V steel, Cr-Ni steel, Cr-Mo steel, Cr-Ni-Mo steel, Cr-Mn-Si steel, high-tensile steel and stainless steel. The allocation of the material number to the material on the display is as follows:

Press  to choose hardness and tensile strength measurement.


Note: You can only measure tensile strength with impact devices of type D and DC. With all other types of impact devices, you can only measure hardness.

When measuring hardness, press  to change the scale of hardness. The supported scales of hardness are: HL, HV, HB, HRC, HS, HRB and HRA.

Note:

- Only the valid scales of hardness for the chosen impact device and material are displayed. Invalid scales of hardness are not displayed.
- Please choose the material first before you choose the scale of hardness.
- The preset scale of hardness changes to HL automatically as soon as the preset material is changed.

6.3.3 To change the impact direction



Press  to change the set impact direction.

6.3.4 To set the number of measurements for average calculations**Error codes**

6.3.5 To set the average time

You can determine the average time between 1 and 32 as follows:




- Press  during the testing phase. The impact time symbol starts to flash. Set the desired impact time via the arrow keys.
- Press  again to leave the menu.

6.3.6 To save data

The maximum number of files you can save on the device is one hundred (F00-F99). When you click  once after completion of the measurement, the "AVE" symbol appears and the measurement results are saved. The newly saved file is displayed as the last file in the memory. This function makes it possible to the user to view saved data and to delete files / groups.





6.3.7 To view saved files

To retrieve saved data, take the following steps:

- Press  to call the data log function. The memory symbol appears. The current file name, the test parameters of the group and the main value of the group are displayed. If there is no data in the memory, the display will show <E04> and the device returns to normal mode.
- Use the arrow keys to select the value to be viewed.
- Press  to view the details of these group data.
- Use the arrow keys again to view each single reading of this group.
- By pressing , you can always return to the previous screen.

6.3.8 To delete the selected files

To delete saved data, take the following steps:

- Press  to call the data log function. The memory symbol appears. The current file name, the test parameters of the group and the main value of the group are displayed. If there is no data in the memory, the display will show <E04> and the device returns to normal mode.
- Use the arrow keys to select the value to be viewed.
- Press  to select the value to be deleted.
- Press the  key. The file is automatically deleted and the display will show “-DEL”.
- By means of the  key, you can always return to the previous screen.

Note: Do not switch off the device during the deletion process as this may cause system errors.


6.3.9 Automatic power off

The device is equipped with an automatic power off function to increase battery life. After five minutes of inactivity (no keystroke or measurement), the device switches itself off independently. Before switching off, the display flashed for 20 seconds. During this phase, you can interrupt automatic power off by pressing any key (except on / off key).


6.3.10 Connection to a computer

The device is equipped with an RS232 interface. By means of the software and the data cable included in the delivery contents, the device can be connected to a computer or an external hard disk. Consult the software manual for further information.

6.3.11 To reset the device

Press and hold the  key while switching on the device. The device will be reset to factory defaults. This may help if the parameters of the device are misaligned.



6.3.12 Backlight

In a dark environment, it is easier to work with the backlight on. Press the  anytime the device is switched on to switch the backlight on or off. Since the backlight consumes a lot of energy, only switch it on if necessary.

7 Maintenance and cleaning

7.1 To change the battery

Warning: To avoid faulty measurements, change the batteries at an early stage. Bear the correct polarity in mind.

When the display shows the symbol , this indicates that the battery is low. The more black bars are visible, the more battery voltage is left. If the batteries are almost flat, an empty battery symbol  flashes. You must always replace both batteries (type AA).

7.2 Cleaning

After using the impact device approx. 1000 – 2000 times, please clean the loading tube and the impact body with the nylon brush which is included in the delivery contents. When you want to clean the loading tube, first unscrew the bearing ring, then take the impact body out and turn the nylon brush counterclockwise until you reach the bottom of the loading tube. Pull the brush out about five times. Put the impact body back into the bearing ring and screw the bearing ring back on.

Remove the impact body from the device after use.

Make sure that no lubricants get into the device!

Only clean the meter with a damp cloth and do not use abrasives or solvents.

7.3 Maintenance procedure

If you use the Rockwell calibration block and the deviation is higher than 2 HRC, a possible reason can be wear and tear of the impact body. The spherical probe tip and the impact body should be replaced. If the hardness tester behaves unusually, do not disassemble any fixed parts or try to repair them. Contact PCE Instruments in this case.

8 Disposal

For the disposal of batteries, the 2006/66/EC directive of the European Parliament applies. Due to the contained pollutants, batteries must not be disposed of as household waste. They must be given to collection points designed for that purpose.

In order to comply with the EU directive 2012/19/EU we take our devices back. We either re-use them or give them to a recycling company which disposes of the devices in line with law.



